of Franklin and State of Virginia, being somewhat Indisposed in body but
of sound mind and Calling to mind The uncertainty of Life and that It
is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will
and Testament for disposing of what worldly goods Providence has blessed
me with in the following manner to wit

First I Recommend my soul to god that gave it and my Body Executors Acorn
secondly, I direct, that, my funeral Expence and Just. debts, be paid

Item, I give and bequeath, to two sons George Robinson and William
Robinson, the land of Land, whereon I now live on Black water River

to be divided by a line which has been run some time past, Beginning
at a Chestnut tree on the South side of said River and running a South Course

to a black or dark Black line said Line tree was marked, when run the upper
part to George Robinson where he has had Possession for some time past, to

him here and assigns forever, the lower part ^{side} ~~and~~ River whereon I now
live to William Robinson, to him his heirs and assigns forever, Item

I give and bequeath to my loving wife Jane Magdalen during her Natural
Life, the whole of the Land whereon I now live, upon Condition, that she shall

Not have power to Give the benefit of Cultivating or selling the said Land to any
other person or persons, whatever person, immediately, that the said George and Will-

iam do Improve and Cultivate their several parts. So the Proceeds to her shall
make her Comfortable living, Item, I give to my four daughters Phibe Denton

Leah Stetson, Susannah Vest, Judith Quincy and Rebekah Stewfen all my
Personal property after my decease to be equally divided amongst them five their

heirs and assigns forever, and lastly I constitute my loving and trusty son
George Robinson and my trusty friends James Bane and Swinfield Hill

my Executors of this my last will and Testament utterly Revoking all other
Wills Legacies and Testaments Ratifying this and no other as my last Will

affixed my seal this 16th day 1796
