In a Court held for Franklin County January 5<sup>th</sup> 1818

This Last Will and Testament of Alexander Ferguson deceased, was produced in Court by Eli Ferguson and Thomas Ferguson the Executors herein named, and proved by the Oath of William Salmon, and James Leftwich for the witnesses hereunto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of the said Executors, who took the oaths prescribed by Law, and together with Nathan Taylor and William Chidless their securities entered into and acknowledged their Bond in the penalty of twenty thousand dollars conditioned according to Law. Certificate is granted them for obtaining a Probate in due form.
