In the name of God, Amen, I William Chitwood, of the County  
of Franklin and State of Virginia, being then in health though  
of sound memory, make this my last Will and Testament;  
first I commit my Soul to God, who gave it, I may beg to the  
Aunt from whence it came, hoping it to be buried in a decent  
and Christianly manner, and after my death, as for my  
Worldly goods, after paying my burial expence and all my just  
Debts, I give and bequeath to my wife Susanna Chitwood, all  
my land and possessions, as long as she liveth, also one bedstead  
and furniture, one choice Cow and calf, two choice hogs to fatten,  
all the rest of the free property to be sold at the best prices  
and the money to be divided among my Children, my Son Squire,  
and Mathias, Sally Perdue Franky; as for my son Joel Chitwood  
he is in my debt one hundred Dollars, for which he is to keep  
for all his claim against my Estate, I leave and desire my  
Sons Mathias Chitwood and Eli Perdue to act and be my  
executors of my Estate. In Witness whereof I have hereunto  
set my hand and Seal this thirteenth day of February one  
thousand eight hundred and twenty two  
I also Will to my daughter Lyssey McMillon the sum of five  
Dollars and no more
