forty eight pounds for Boarding, Tuition & Clothing four years
likewise the account marked C Shows Ada Faris is indebted
to the Guardian Joshua Brizendine forty eight pounds for
Boarding, Tuition & Clothing for four years. There is no
documents produced before us that shows the orphans have
property real or personal & from the papers produced by the
Guardian Brizendine it does not appear that he has any
property in his hands belonging to the orphans which he
positively declares he has no negroes nor lands. that he
got himself appointed their Guardian to give him power
to sue for property which he thought was their right

Know all men by these presents that I Stephen Winfree of the County of Franklin and State of Virginia being in low state of health but of sound mind and good memory do make this my last Will and Testament in form & manner as follows to wit, in the first place that all my just debts be paid by the sale of my land, Negroes or other property, which shall be most advisable, or to the interest of my Estate, by my Wife or some person for her is my wish and desire and secondly all Property after my debts be paid and settled, balance or residue of my Estate being in land, Negroes, or other property, my Will and desire is, that the whole of such Balance, or residue of my Estate shall go to my beloved wife Mary Winfree and by these presents I do give and confirm unto her all such balance of my Estate forever to enjoy and dispose off as she my beloved wife Mary Winfree may think proper, And lastly I do appoint my beloved wife Mary Winfree my Executrix, and that the Court shall not rule her to security when qualified as my Executrix, In Witness whereof I have this 19th day of May set my hand and seal in presence of
