Heirs and assigns forever, all my two Tracts of Land in
Botetourt County now in the possession of the said William
Gray Junr. Also one Negro boy William at the end of three years
from my death to hold during his life and then to be divided
between his Lawful Heirs also I give unto my Step Daughter Mary
Beber my bay mare one Saddle and bridle one Cow and calf
one ewe one sow and pigs one bed bed stead and Furniture for
ever also I give and bequeath unto my Loving wife Mary Gray
all the rest of my Stock of Horses, Cows, Hogs, and sheep, Household
and kitchen furniture for ever and my Negro boy William
for three years from my death, and after that time is to go
my son William Gray, Heir
~~and be directed~~ I also give unto my wife Mary Gray all
the Land whereon I now live for three years from my
Death, to enjoy for her own use, and at the end of the term
of three years from my death and at the end of the term
of three years from my death I devise unto my Wife Mary
Gray during her life and widowhood the lower end of
my Tract of Land Encloding the Houses to be divided by
the crop fence abov the Orchard with a strale line to
Moses Green Jr. and Moses Green Sr. lines also all the Legacy
that is or may be coming to me or her from the estate of her
husband to have and to enjoy for ever Also my

121 I intend to have and to enjoy for ever I give and Bequeath unto my
Grand son John Gray son of William Gray for all the Land that
is given to my Wife, after her time is out to be rented out by my
Executor till he shall arrive to the age of twenty one years and
the money arising there from to go to his use. Also the Land left
