and my soul to God who gave it. And touching my worldly
Estate it is my will and desire first that all my just debts
be paid and the lands belonging to me on the South side of Cyp^r River
be sold also my Wagon and three Cows and hogs &c. &c. &c. &c.
all the surplus property not needed for the support or use of my
family as my Executors hereinafter named may think proper.
And 2^d It is my will and desire that all the rest of
my Estate both real & personal should remain for the benefit
of my beloved wife and children under age. (viz) their support
and education until my son William Sall McCabe becomes of age
at that time it is my will & desire that my beloved Wife Milly
McCabe should have four of her choicest negroes for the support of her
and the four youngest children for their Education.
3^d And that the balance of the negroes and other surplus property
not needed in the place to be sold for the best Prices in any way
may think proper and the money arising from the sale be
equally divided among my children &c. &c. it is my will and
desire that when my youngest son Thomas Sall McCabe becomes

of age that my beloved wife shall have her two chosen Negroes
 two horses & two cows, two feather beds, ~~stead of furniture~~ as
 many of the farming utensils as my Executors think proper,
 likewise the land & premises whereon I now live or otherwise to be
 plentifully supported during her natural life &c. 5^{thly} It is my
 will that at her death that all the remaining property real
 & personal be sold for the best prices for the money arising therefrom
 to be equally divided among all my children &c. 6^{thly} It is my will
 that from the commencement of this my will to record that
 all my Estate be under the entire control & management
 of my Executors & subject to the payment of no debts but what
 is contracted by them or their order. 7^{thly} It is my Will that
 my Wife with the advice or consent of my Executors may lend
 each of my Daughters a negro & piece of land by their giving
 bond and sufficient security for their deliverance at the
 time & place becomes of age or any thing else that can be
 spared at Valuation that they may need. 8^{thly} I will that my sons that are of age may be employed
 by my Executors to look after the business of my wife & family
 as long as they do well & no longer. 9^{thly} It is my desire that all the surplus money
 that can be raised over & above a comfortable support of my
 family be equally divided between my two eldest sons
 who shall accept for the same &c. And lastly if my
 wife should see cause to marry that my Estate should
 still remain in the hands of my Executors if she comfortable
 supported during her natural life and I do hereby appoint
 constitute and ordain my friend John M. Hollister my
~~lawful Executor to this my last will and Testament and~~
 have affixed my hand & seal in the year of our Lord one

The report of the jury summoned on the examination of the dead body
of an infant female child supposed to be a child of a negro Woman
named Mary belonging to William Brown. We consider that the child
was murdered by wrapping the navel string round the neck three
times (and loosed out of the three times the string was looped)
also by mashing of the head until it was supposed to be more open
than is common for children of that age. Given under our hands
