In the name of God amen. the seventeenth day of October one thousand eight hundred & seven. I William Roberson of Ruspel Parish in the County of Franklin in perfect hours mind and memory thanks be to God. do make - ordain this my present Will & Testament containing there. In my Last will manner and form following, that is to say, first I bequeath my soul and Spirit into the hands of Almighty God my heavenly father by whom of his only grace I trust to be saved, received into eternal rest through the death of my Saviour Jesus Christ my redeemer in his precious blood I set my only hope of my Salvation and as touching the distribution of my mortal goods, I dispose of them as follows, I now give and bequeath to my son Little Berey Roberson One hundred acres of Land more or less, the mained plantation whereon I now live Lydia and Melley to make this their home as long as they live single. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Lydia a feather Bed and furniture, one white face Windsor bow, I give and bequeath to my daughter Melley one feather Bed and furniture, and one red and white bow called pede, and also I desire that the remainder of my Estate should be sold and my debts paid, and then the balance to be equally divided amongst my children, & then my desire is that Estate should not be appraised, and then I do hereby appoint, my son John Roberson & Elias Atherton & Benjamin Watts Executors of this my Last Will & Testament, and Withof to hereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this day of Year above Written

In the name of God amen, I John Booth of Franklin County and State of Virginia being weak in body but of disposing mind and memory, do make this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following, to wit, first I give all my Just debts shall be paid, secondly, I desire my Daughter Agnes Clardy, and my sons Richard Booth Peter Booth, John Booth, Stephen Booth, and my Daughter Mary Guttry shall have one shilling Sterling a piece, Thirdly, I give to my son Benjamin Booth the Tract of Land I now live on containing four hundred acres by survey also Fifty six acres of Land lying in Bedford County on the north side of Stanton River to him and his heirs forever, and fourthly I give to my son Thomas Booth one feather Bed and furniture the rest of my Estate both Real and personal I give shall be held in Trust by Peter Booth of the State of Virginia or by Stephen Booth of the State of Tennessee and the profits thereof to be applied to the use of Thomas Booth during his life, and after his death to be equally divided among three of his children, to wit, Frances, James & Thomas, and I do hereby ^{appoint} my two sons Peter Booth & Benjamin Booth Executors to this my Last Will and Testament, revoking all others desire this may be received as such, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty sixth day of August one thousand eight hundred and seven
