In the name of God, Amen. I William Toney of Franklin County and State of Virginia being Weak in body but of sound mind and memory, blessed be God for his mercys, do this eight day of November in the year of eighteen hundred and four, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following my soul I commend to Almighty God, who gave it me, and my body to the Earth from whence it came in hopes of joyful resurrection through the merits of my Saviour Jesus Christ, and as for that worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with, I dispose thereof as follows First of all I give unto my well beloved wife Margaret Toney her maintenance out of my Estate, and one feather Bed & furniture, two Milch Cows, two hogs, one Christ and all the kitchen Furniture. I give and bequeath unto my son Littlebury Toney, Marion Toney, now Marion Woodson, Elizabeth Toney now Elizabeth Bates, Abigail Toney now

Averila Thompson, Gary Toney my son, Poinceter Toney  
 my son, Edmund Toney my son, eight dollars to be equally  
 divided between them. I give and bequeath unto William  
 Toney my son, and John Toney my son ten pence, to be  
 equally divided between them. I give and bequeath unto  
 Susannah Toney my Daughter part of my Land, Beginning  
 at John Webster's line, leaving the line to a path that leads  
 onto a ridge road on the Top of the Ridge, so on the said  
 road to the old line. Item I give unto my Daughter  
 Susannah Toney two feather Beds, one cow and calf, to  
 her, and her heirs for ever. I give unto Susannah Toney  
 my Grand Daughter one feather Bed and cow and calf to  
 be raised out of my Estate. Item give and bequeath  
 unto my Grand Daughter Mary Ferguson one feather  
 Bed and cow and calf to be raised out of my Estate to her  
 her heirs for ever. I give and bequeath unto Hannah Toney  
 now Hannah Peters, one cow, to her, her heirs for ever. Item  
 I give and bequeath to James Toney my son, Jesse Toney my  
 son, the balance of my Lands to be equally divided between  
 them, my son James to have the upper end of my Land &  
 my son Jesse the lower end, to them, their heirs and assigns  
 for ever. I give the balance of my goods and chattels to my  
 son James Toney, and my son Jesse to them, their heirs &  
 assigns for ever. Lastly I do make and appoint James Toney  
 my son, and Jesse Toney my son Executors of this my last Will &  
 Testament, revoking all former Wills by me made, I appoint  
 this and no other to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness  
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year  
 above written.
