I William Wright of Franklin County am well in health and of perfect senses and nowing thanks be to God for his mercies and caling to mind the mortality of man and that all men once must die I do make constitute ordain and appoint this my last will and Testament in manner and form followeth - Here I give and bequeath unto my Grand son Enoch Wright all my Land and plantation where I now live and all my stock and furniture to him and his heirs for ever and the S. Enoch shall find the S. William with all things that is needs full during his life I likewise appoint my two sons James Wright and George Wright and Enoch Wright my whole and sole Executors and trustees of this my Last Will and Testament Witness my hand and seal the day and Year above written

This Last Will and Testament of William Wright deceased was proved by the oath of Isaac Abshire, Philemon Smith & Abraham Abshire the Witnesses hereto, and ordered to be recorded. And at a Court held for Franklin County September 3<sup>d</sup> 1810, on the motion of George Wright one of the Executors herein named, who took the oath prescribed by Law and together with James Wray his security entered into and acknowledged his Bond in the penalty of fifty Dollars conditioned according to Law, certificate is granted him for obtaining a Probate in due form of Law.

In the name of God Amen 8<sup>th</sup> day of July the last Will and Testament of Samuel Henderson who is in perfect health and memory first I recommend my soul to God who give it and my body to be Decently buried not Douting but at the Resurrection I shall Receive the same by the Almighty power of God that give it and as to my worldly Estate I order it to be divided in the following manner (Viz) first it is my Will that all my Just Debts and former charges to be paid and I order to my son John the sume and cost that Hays recovered by Law and one Dollar I order to my son Samuel one hundred pounds I order to my son James son Samuel fifty pounds I order to my son William fifty pounds I order to my Daughter Jean ten pounds and to my Daughter Margrit ten pounds I order to my Daughter Nancy one Negro named Charety and one horse or more at her own choosing one bed and belouths and three cows and my Dask and the furniture of the Dreyer I order to Nancy son twenty pounds and to her Daughter one bed and belouths and I order the Rest of my moveable Estate to be Equely divided betwixt my three Daughters to wit Nancy Sarah and Martha and as for my Land I order it to be divided to my foresaid Daughter Nancy to have the Buildings and orchard in her part and if my three Daughters agree to Sale my Land I order what they Sale it for to equely Divided between them and them to make a Deed to the byer I do make and ordain my son William and Tobias Miller to be my whole and sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament I hereby disallow revoke and every other Will former Testaments Wills legacies Retifying confirming this and no other to my last Will and Testament in witness I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 8<sup>th</sup> day of July 1806
