And whereas, there are several tracts of land taken up in the name of Robert Groove ^{Green} last in which I am a partner, as also several tracts of land taken up in my name by me of which the said Robert Groove ^{Green} is to have a part; I therefore hope and am persuaded that he the said Robert Groove ^{Green} will with Justice and Equity divide the said lands and make deed for said farms according to law to my said wife.

I do hereby appoint and ordain my said beloved wife Mary my whole and sole Executrix of this my last will and testament and it is my desire that no part or parcel of my Estate be appraised. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this eighth day of September, 1846.
