and perfect memory and knowing the uncertainty of
this life on earth and being desirous to settle things in
order do make this my last Will and Testament in manner
and form following. That is to say first and principally
I commend my soul to Almighty God who gave it and my
body to the Earth from whence it was taken to be buried in
such decent and Christian like manner as to my executors
hereafter named shall be thought meet and convenient
And as touching such worldly estate as the Lord in mercy
hath bestowed on me my Will and meaning is the same
shall be employed and bestowed as hereafter by this my
last Will and Testament expressed. And first to have the
conscience frustrate and make void all Wills by me former-
ly made and done and to appoint this my last Will
and Testament. Item I give and bequeath unto my be-
loved wife Elizabeth Glass my Negro Rosannah and her
choice of one more of the female Negroes and one hundred
and seventy pounds in any other moveable estate of
mine for her the said Elizabeths own use and to be at

my moveable estate remaining be sold as soon as conveniently
may occur after my death, only my wearing Apparel to be
equally divided among my four sons to wit Samuel Robert
Joseph and David and that my land and the remainder of
my Negros be at the management and direction of my
Executors for the use and benefit of the family that is
my beloved wife and my eight youngest children Joseph
Sarah Elizabeth Martha Ruth Davis Nancy and Sophia
until my youngest daughter be the age of eighteen
years or in case she should not live until that age it
shall be until my youngest living be at the age of ma-^{re}
turity at which time I then will and empower my Execu-
tors to sell and dispose of the whole of my land to the best
advantage they can and to make due & conveyances as
sufficient and lawful and from my own hand and to
pay off the legacies ahereafter mentioned Item I give
and bequeath unto my son Samuel Glass thirty pounds
good and Lawful money of Virginia Item I give and
bequeath unto my son Robert Glass twelve pounds
Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary
Rose thirty pounds Item I give and bequeath unto my
daughter Georgata Wilson thirty pounds Item I give and
bequeath unto my six youngest daughters Sarah Glass
Elizabeth Glass Martha Glass Ruth Glass Nancy Glass
and Sophia Glass each and every one of them One hundred
pounds Item I give and bequeath unto my two youngest
sons Joseph Glass and David Glass the sum of two hundred
pounds each and it is likewise my Will and desire that my
Executors at the time appointed for selling my land
sell also the remainder of my Negros to my children be
forementioned at publick sales and to them only giving
first such timely notice to each and every one of them as
would give time to attend the sale and convenient with
them as far as their legacies go in that way but if my
estate both real and personal should amount to more
than the legacies aherore mentioned it is my Will and
desire that the remainder be divided to every one accord-
ing to the sums mentioned to them before and it is likewise
my Will and desire that if my estate as before mentioned
should not amount to the sums aherore mentioned that

such and every one of them my legatees should fall short in proportionable the sum bequeathed to them. It is also my will and desire that of any of my children before mentioned who should die before of age that their share of my estate shall be equally divided among the living. And it is my will and desire that Samuel Glass and Robert Glass and William Vance be my Executors of this my last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this day and year written.
