one of her the said Ann's furniture to wit her Dressing
her Bedding boxes and her side Saddle.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son George Hollingsworth
two hundred and fifty Acres of land being part of the One Thousand two
Hundred and fifty Acres of land lying joining to the land I gave to Ben-
jamin Carter on both sides of the Creek I give it to him his heirs and
Assigns forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son in law Benjamin Carter
and to his Heirs and Assigns forever Four hundred Acres of land lying
on both sides of the Creek I give it to him his heirs and Assigns forever.

Old Tract together with all and singular the Buildings and Appur-
tenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son George Hollingsworth the
Sum of Seven pounds Ten Shillings of current Money or in London,
Hollingsworth shall pay to him Twelve months after my Death

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Lydia Keell my of
Feather Beds and Farn hereunto belonging

Lastly I do hereby Name and appoint my Wife and my
Law Isaac Keell and my Son Isaac Hollingsworth Executors of this
my last Will and Testament hereby revoking Annulding and utterly
making void all former and other Wills by me heretofore made
