& then to Extend it self North to the old Patent Line the which
I give unto him his heirs & assigns for ever
Thirdly I give & Demise the Remainging part of the land
belonging to the Tract whereon I now live which is not
already Disposed off unto my Three sons, John George &
David Prop to be equally Divided among them the which
I give to them their Heirs & assigns for ever
Fourthly I give & bequeath unto my well beloved wife
Catherine Prop the Thirds of my personal Estate with the
house wherein we now dwell & the Use & produce of the
Orchard During her Natural Life Fifthly I give and
bequeath unto my daughter Mary the sum of
