buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executor not doubt-
ing but at the generall Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the
mighty power of God and as touching my worldly Estate whatsoever God
heath blessed me I give demise and dispose of the same in the following man-
ner and form First I give to my daughter Anna M^{rs} Macker born of my
own body one half of my goods & chattels and moveables and likewise my
whole Aperiell to be delivered to her the ³ Anna M^{rs} Macker by my Executors
after my decease to the proper use and behoof of her the ³ M^{rs} Macker her heirs
Executors Administrators and assigns forever

And I do hereby appoynt nominate and constitute my dutifull son
Frances Lilburn born of my own body my sole Executor of this my last Will
and Testament and I do hereby disallow revoke and disannull all and every
former Wills Testaments Legacies bequests and Executions by me in any
ways before named willed and bequeathed Ratifying and confirming this
to be my last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seal the 23rd day of August above written
