I Arthur Barrett of Orphan in the County of Frederick
in the Colony of Virginia German being Sick & weak of Body but
of a sound & well Disposing Mind & memory do make this my
Last Will & Testament Revoking all other Wills & Testaments that

Debts & Funerals Charges be Defrayed as soon as possible after
my Decease

I Give & Bequeath unto my Son William Barnett one
Hundred Acres of Land belonging to the Tract whereon I now
live, he having made an Improvement thereon & live
thereon which is to be Included in the 3^d Hundred Acres being
part of the lower end of my Tract I Give y^e same to him & his
Heirs & Assigns for ever.

I Give & Bequeath unto my Son James Barnett five
hundred Acres of the above^d Tract of Land Including y^e Improve-
ment he hath already made on y^e side of my Tract of Land
lying toward Joins Bullingiers y^e which Land I Give to him
and and his heirs for ever as also to his Assigns.

I Give & Bequeath unto my Son John Barnett one
hundred & fifty Acres of Land Including the Plantation where
on he now lives the which I Give to him his heirs & Assigns
for ever.

I Give & bequeath unto my Son Benjamin Barnett
the Plantation with all the Improvements whereon I now
live with all the remaining part of y^e Land belonging to
y^e 3^d Tract which is left Unbequeathed belonging to y^e said
Tract for him to Enjoy it after his mother's Decease y^e Land

that all my life shall have enjoy all
