I give I leave to Colonel James Wood and Mary his Wife Two Guineas to
purchase two Mourning Rings

I give and Bequeath to Margherita Palmer One Guinea to purchase
one Mourning Ring

I give and bequeath to Thomas Wood my Bottle Case and Elbow
Chair now at his House

I give It is my Will and Desire that my Land in Fairfax should be spe-
cifically sold to discharge my debts and that all my moveables except what is
sufficient to support a Quarter should be sold and that four horses may be
kept at the Quarter on the roads and that they remain there during Mr.
Harris's pleasure and afterwards to be removed at the discretion of the
Executors

I give and bequeath to my daughter Mildred my Gold Mo-
urning Ring half a Dozen Tea silver spoons and One pair of Longs

I give and bequeath to Sarah Wood Two Pistols to be appo-
riated as she thinks proper

I give my Will is if Mr. Green comes up he is to value the Medecines
and Books and other utensils belonging to my Profession and my desire
is that Mr. Green have any of my Medecines and Books he thinks
fit to

I give my desire is also that my servant Boy James Clerkson should
be sold to the highest bidder

is at the Town.

I Henry Bonstetter and appoint my well beloved Friends John James Wood and Marquis Calmes Executors of this my last Will and Testament and do hereby utterly disavow revoke and disannul all and every other Wills and Testaments by me made Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the day and Year above Written.
