I being hope of Spunk in the Colony of Virginia being
sick & weak of Body but of a well Disposing mind & memory
Do make this my last Will & Testament, & I do hereby Dispose
of my Real & personal Estate as followeth
First my Will is that my Body be decently buried & all my
Just Debts & funeral Charges be Dispayd as soon as possible
after my Decease Secondly my Will is that all my Real
& personal Estate may be equally Divided between all my
Brothers & Sisters Excepting my Sister Anna Day living
at Nottingham unto Whom I give & bequeath Ten Shillings
The rest of my Goods & Chattels as also the Land Demised
unto me by my fathers Will I leave to be Divided as above
excepting my Riding House which I give & bequeath unto
my Brother George Robt over & above what is above mentioned
Moreover my Right that I have to my fathers personal
Estate & also what may Accrue to me from the thirds which
was left by my fathers Will to my Deceased Mother I leave
to be Divided as above said Lastly I Ordain & constitute
my two Brothers John & George Robt sole Executors of this
my last Will & Testament hereby revoking any other
Will or Wills by me made

excepting my Briding house which I give & bequeath unto
my Brother George Hope over & above what is above mentioned
Moreover my Right that I have to my fathers personal
Estate & also what may Accrue to me from the Thirds which
was left by my fathers Will to my Deceased Mother I leave
to be Divided as above said. Lastly I Ordain & constitute
my two Brothers John & George Hope Executors of this
my last Will & Testament hereby revoking any other
Will or Wills that may have been made by me or
by me in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
& Seal. Dated at Opeckon in the County of Frederick &c
Colony of Virginia the 3^d of the 9th month November 1748.

At a Court holden & held for Frederick County on Wednesday
the 7th day of December 1748.

This Will of David Ross dec'd was proved in open Court by the
Solemn Affirmation of James Wright & by the oath of William
Gilliam two of the Witnesses thereto who also Declared they saw
George Kable the other Witness Sign the same as a Evidence &
George Ross the Executor having solemnly affirmed to the same according
to Law it was Admitted to Record.

the first Justice in the Commission of the peace for Frederick
County for & in behalf and to the sole use & behoof of the Justices
of the said County & their successors in the sum of two hundred
Pounds To be paid to the S^t. Marguerite Calmees his Executors
Administ^r and Assigns To the which payment well & truly to be
made We Bind ourselves & every of us our heirs of our Heirs
Execut^r & Admin^r jointly & severally firmly by these presents
Sealed with our Seals Dated this 7th Day of December 1748.
