In the Name of God I ~~George Robson~~ of the County of
Frederick and Colony of Virginia being sick and weak of body but of perfect Mind and
Masonry do make and constitute this my last Will and Testament in manner and
form following VVZ

Imprimis It is my Will that all my Just Debts Contracts and engagements
together my Funerall charges be fully paid and satisfied out of moveable Estate
Item I give Devise and bequeath unto my Grandson George Robson Junr
all this my Plantations whereon I now live save only Three hundred Acres
at the lower end of the same to be divided off for my Grandson William to

Three hundred acres of this my Patent land in the former part of my life
now as aforesaid to be divided off to him and his Heirs and assigns for
as also privilege and liberty of the Orchard on that side near the
Barn for the Term of Eight or Nine Years until he can have an Or-
chard for himself

I Here Give devise and bequeath unto my Son George Hobson
Three hundred acres of land lying on Middle Creek and adjoining to the
former lying to him and whereon he now liveth to him his Heirs and
forever

I Here Give and bequeath unto my Son and my Daughter Hannah Hobson
and my Slave called Bobb

I Here Give and bequeath to my two Grandsons John and George
Hobson my 3 breeding Mares called Black Jewell and Jennet
and behoof of the 2 boys and their Heirs forever

I Here Make it necessary that the 3 Mares be valued and put
into the Custody of my Son George and the Estimate of Value of them be
rendered to the 2 boys at their coming to Age

I Here the Residue of my moveable Estate I Give devise and bequeath
unto my Wife Elizabeth Hobson and my Son George Hobson and their
Heirs forever willing and requiring that my Wife if she survive me
have a comfortable living out of my said Estate during her natural life

I Here I Ordain and constitute my loving Wife Elizabeth Hobson
and my Son George Hobson Executors of this my last will and Testament
hereby revoking all former Wills by me ^{at any time} heretofore made Ratifying
and confirming this as my only last Will and Testament in Writing

and my son George Hobson Executors of this my last Will and Testament
hereby revoking all former Wills by me heretofore made Ratifying
and confirming this as my only last Will and Testament in WITNESS
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this Nineteenth day
of November in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred &
