out of my Estate that is personally & also my funeral
by Executors after named. Next to Robert Mackay &
Patience Mackay his wife I will & bequeath all my
whole Estate November 3rd 1748

Deceased do make or cause to be made a true & perfect
Inventory of all & singular the Goods Chattels & Credits
of the said Deceased which have or shall come to the hands
possession or knowledge of the said Robert M^c Coy or into the
hands or possession of any other person or persons for him and
the same so made do exhibit or cause to be Exhibited into the
County Court of Sandwich at such Time as he shall be

call all the goods Chattels & Credits of the said Deceased at the Time of
his Death which at any time after shall come to the hands or possession
of the said Robert McCloy or into the hands & possession of any other per-

And further Do make a just & true Account of all his Actions & Doings
therein when thereunto required by the said Court & all the rest & Do
residue of the said Goods Chattels & Credits which shall be found
remaining upon the said Administration Account, the same being
first Examined & allowed by the Justices of the Court for the time being
shall Deliver & pay unto such person or persons as & as often as the
said Justices by their Order or Judgment shall Direct pursuant to
the Law in that Case made & provided, and if it shall hereafter
Appear that any last Will & Testament was made by the said
Deceased & the Executor or Executors therein Named Do exhibit the
same into the said Court Making request to have it allowed and
approved accordingly if the said Robert McCloy bring thereunto
required Do receive & Deliver up his Letters of Administration
Approval of such Testament being first had & made in the said
