In the Name of God Amen The 7. day of September in the Year of Our Lord One
Thousand Seven hundred and Forty Eight I Hugh Parrell of the County of Frederick
being sick of body but of good and perfect memory (I am able to know my mind) do
make hereunto my will and declare this my last will and Testament in man-
ner and form following repealing and annulling by these presents all former
any Testament and Testaments Written or to be Written by me or by any other
declared either by word or Writing Nothing also confirming this and no
other to be my last will and Testament And as touching my worldly Estate
wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with in this life I give devise and
dispose in the following manner.

I give devise and bequeath to my Son Edward Parrell Two hun-
dred Acres of Land lying to Doctor Daniel Hart and John Milbourn to him
and his Heirs forever one hundred being patented and the other being that
which is surveyed and the Plot returned to the Secretarys Office and also
Ten Acres of my Marsh for the term of Fifteen years to be laid off at the
lowest end of the same by a line a brook.

Item I give and bequeath to my sons Joseph and John Parrell the
part of my Patented land to be equally divided between them in the full
manner of 11. 1st and thereof to be my son Joseph and the other to be
son John who is to include the plantation to them & their heirs for ever

Item I give and bequeath to my loving Kinsman John Parrell
Three hundred Acres of land be the same more or less lying
on the South West side of Red-bud Creek and forming on my other Paten-
ted land which said Three hundred Acres of land is not yet Patented but
surveyed and returned to the Secretarys Office

Item I give and bequeath to my loving wife Ann Parrell a Body
and bleats the Bay Mare I had of William Gaddis and her 4 yearling
Colt which belonged to her Old Mare.

Item my Will is that my loving Wife shall have the sole use of my
Plantation so long as she remains my Widow.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Joseph the Robin horse the
Bay Mare and black Mare which I had formerly given him before.

Item my Will is that after my Just debts are paid that the residue
of my personal Estate shall be equally divided between my 3 Wives and
my three sons and my daughter Christian.

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Christian Ten pounds
to be paid to her when she comes of age by my sons Joseph &
John in equal proportion and if any of my 3 sons should die before
she comes of age that then the Survivors of them shall pay her the sum
afore said

Item my Will is that if either of my 3 sons Joseph and John should
die before they come of age

them to be equally divided between him and my son Edward and if my
sons Joseph and John should die before they come of Age then my
Will is that the Lands I Willed them shall descend to my son Edward

Ilem I do hereby appoint my well beloved Wife Ann Parrish Executor
my son Edward Parrish and my Cousin Robert Calvert Executors of this
my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and seal this day and Year above written
