In the Name of God Amen The second day of November
one Thousand Seven Hundred & forty eight, I Hugh Paul
of Frederick County in the Colony of Virginia being of
perfect Memory & Reasonable & Able to do
make & Ordain this my last Will & Testament in manner
& following I Bequeath my Soul unto the hands
of Almighty God my Maker, hoping that through the
Meritorious Death & passion of Jesus Christ my only
Saver & Redeemer to Receive Grace pardoning for my sins
and as for my Body to be Buried in Christ like Burial
at the discretion of my Children. I Give & bequeath
to my Son John Paul three Cows & two Calves & two year
olds, one Steer & one heifer five Horses & Mares only
paying unto his Sister Catharine five pound Pennsylvania
Money & his share of the sheep. I Give & bequeath to my
Son Robert if ever he Returns Whomever my two places
Pennsylvania money and but if he should not live to
return that then these places is to be divided to every one
of the Children only John must have no part of it
I Give & bequeath to my Son George this place that now
lies on according to the provisions for me & my wife
is to have her maintenance out of the place as long as
she lives & George is to have the salt that now follows
the Gray Mares
I Give & bequeath all the rest of my Goods and the title and

Term to have to my son George this place that I now
live on according to the divisions I made & my wife
is to have her maintenance out of the place as long as
she lives & George is to have the felt that now follows
the Gray Marsh.

I have to leave all the rest of my Good and Chattels and
all that pertains to me to be equally divided,
to Andrew William Cathran & George with their
Mother having her equal share and tis my last Will
& Testament touching all other matters whatsoever
as Witnesses my hand this Day & year above mentioned

At a Court continued & held for Frederick County on
Wednesday the 7th day of June 1749.
This Will of Hugh Paul deceased was produced in open Court
by the Oaths of Hugh Lytle & Margaret Kennedy who also made
oath that they saw John Ingels the other Witness sign the same
as an Evidence and Andrew Paul & Wm Paul having
made oath to the same according to Law the same is admitted
