that is to say principally and first of all I give and Recommend
my Soul to God that gave it and for my body I recommend it to
the Earth to be buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion
of my Executors nothing Doubting but at the General Resurrection
I shall Receive the same again by the mighty Power of God and
Touching such worldly Estate it hath pleased God to bless me with
in this life I give and dispose of the same in manner and form
following To wit I will all the funeral Charges and my
Just Debts should be paid
Item I give and bequeath unto my eldest son Michael Parker the half
share of the land and also one cow and calf for he now has his partner be-
fore called by his mother in Germany -
Item I give and bequeath to my next eldest son Philip Parker and my
youngest son George Parker all my Land I have in this Colony of Vir-
ginia and all the I Land with the buildings and all the appurte-
nances thereto belonging are to be valued and divided at the
discretion of my Executors what they think the best for me it will
Amount to in money then my 2 sons Philip and George Parker are to
pay me money to their brothers and John (Wm) Handover John Hand

Barbary and Frederick Peter have equal shares of the money and the
may be equally divided share share make my my son children
then I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Barbary Peter all my estate
both real and personal during her natural life if she remain single
but if she does cause to get married again I give her no love and color
and nothing more but my estate real and personal as above mentioned
and are immediately to be divided among my seven children and children
and appoint John Napier George Pellinger and John Hede executors
to this my last will and Testament

the 14 day of February 1760

This will of John Wolderich Peter deceased was proved in open Court by the oath
of Edward Rogers the only subscribing Creditor thereto which was allow-
ed by the Court a legal proof and Barbary Peter the Executrix having
made oath to the same according to Law it was admitted to Record
