Executors within twelve months after my Decease twenty Shillings Virginia Currency.
Item I give to my son Richard Chinoweth to be paid as aforesaid the sum of twenty
Shillings of like money aforesaid.

Item I give to my son William Chinoweth to be paid as aforesaid twenty Shillings Vir-
ginia Currency.

Item I give to my son Thomas Chinoweth to be paid in like manner the sum of ten
by five Shillings of like currency.

Item I give to my son James Chinoweth all my wearing Apparel.

Item I give to my daughter Sarah Chinoweth her share of my household Goods.

Item It is my Will that the Deeds of Gift already made by me to my son Thomas
Chinoweth & John Chinoweth my dear sons of my said land & other Real Estate therein
contained stand good & Valid according to the purport & true meaning thereof.

Item The residue of my Estate Real and Personal after my just Debts & Funeral Charges paid
I give Devise and Bequeath to be equally Divided betwixt my Wife & my three Daughters Mary
Watson, Hannah Carter & Ruth Bates. Item I do make constitute & appoint my son Thomas
Chinoweth & James Carter Executors of this my last Will & Testament. hereby revoking all
former and other Wills by me at any time heretofore made. In Witness whereof the said
John Chinoweth has hereunto set my hand & Seal this Eleventh Day of April in the
Year of our Lord One Thousand seven hundred and forty six.

Chinoweth & John Patch my daughter Mary Chinoweth & my daughter Hannah

contained stand good & Valid according to the purport & true meaning thereof.

I give the residue of my Estate Real and Personal after my Just Debts be paid to my wife Mary
Chinoweth & my daughter Sarah to be equally divided between my wife & my three daughters Mary

Watson, Hannah Carter & Ruth Bates. I do make constitute & appoint my son Thomas
Chinoweth & James Carter Executors of this my last Will & Testament. hereby revoking all

former and other Wills by me at any time heretofore made. In Witness whereof I the said
