Will

In the Name of God Amen The twentieth day of February 1747
I Rebecca Lucas of ^{Richmond} County in the Colony of Virginia being in
health of Body and perfect in Mind and Memory Thanks be to Almi-
ghty God therefore and knowing the Mortality of my Body and that it
is appointed for me to die do make and Order this my last Will
and Testament that when I shall die I do give and recommend my Soul into
the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my Body to the Earth to be
buried in a Christian like manner at the Discretion of my Executors
not doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same
again by the mighty Power of God and as touching my Worldly Estate
whereunto God hath blessed me I give devise and dispose of the same
in the following manner and form

First I give and bequeath to Robert Lucas (second son to my Cousin
Edward Lucas of this place) the sum of thirty pounds Pennsylvania money
on Bond due to me from my Cousin Robert Lucas of Bucks County
in Pennsylvania together with the whole Interest now due on the bond
and what shall become due to him that I Robert Lucas his heirs Ex-
ecutors Administrators or assigns forever when he shall attain the
age of Twenty one

Edward Lucas the sum of fifty pounds Pennsylvania Money now due to me together
with said Cousin Edward Lucas two Pastoral Bonds 25 £ each and also
by two pounds more lent him for which I have not Bond and some pounds
more which he borrowed at diverse times after all Pennsylvania Money and also some
pounds due to me from Robert Fox of this place for which I have no Writing all
which mentioned together with all my Estate I do here bequeath & give to her
here or else where to him his Heirs Executors or Assigns to use when he shall
attain the age of Twenty One.

I Item Give and bequeath to Elizabeth Lucas (daughter to my aforesaid
Cousin Edward Lucas) two Gold rings and all my wearing apparel & do
give to her her Heirs Executors Administrators or Assigns for ever when she the
Elizabeth shall come to age or on Marriage day if she shall marry before she
come to Age but notwithstanding my Estate is thus bequeathed I may will
that if either of the before mentioned Robert or William Lucas do happen to
die before they shall come to Age to receive their respective Legacies in such
Case the other Surviving Brother shall have the deceased Brothers Legacy
as fully as if it had been first bequeathed to him to the purpose and intent
of him his Heirs Executors Administrators or Assigns for ever and may Well
think if they both shall happen to die before they shall come to age to receive
their Legacies that then the aforesaid Elizabeth their Sister shall have
both wholly and singularly the whole Estate to her her Heirs for
administrators or Assigns for ever and if it shall happen that ^{they} both
William and Elizabeth shall all die before they come to age to receive their
Legacies

shall have and enjoy all and every part of my whole Estate and

Executors by me in any ways before made made and legitimated ratifying
and confirming this to be my last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have

At a Court held for Frederick County on Tuesday the second day
of August 1748.

This will of Rebecca Lucas decd was proved in open Court by the Oaths of Andrew
Corn and Thomas Hart who also made Oaths that they saw Rebecca Greenwood
subscribe the same and Edward Lucas the Executor thereof having sworn
Oaths to the same according to law it was admitted to Record Teste.
