In the name of God Amen. The eleventh day of December 1862, I Thomas Anderson
of Frederick County and County of Virginia Blacksmith being sick and weak of
Body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given to Almighty God for the
same and calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing it is appointed
for all men once to die, do make and publish this my last will and Testament
in manner and form following (to wit)

That is to say principally and first of all I recommend implied to God that give
it nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection of the dead I shall receive
the same again by the Almighty power of God and as touching such worldly
substance as it hath pleased God to bless me th in this life I dispose of in man-
ner and form following

Imprimis my will and desire is that all my Just debts and fune-
ral charges be first paid in some convenient time after my decease by my
Executors hereafter named

Sum of two pounds Current money to be paid to her name mon the after my
cease together with her Choice of two Cows and one third part of my Sheep my
Simp mare and Colt.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son James Anderson Three hundred
Acres of Land it being the plantation whereon I now dwell on Mitchell Creek
of a Tract of Eight hundred Acres together with a good Mill lately by me built
on the said Mill Creek with all the appurtenances thereto belonging
and every part thereof to him his Heirs and Assigns forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Collier Anderson the Sum
of Twenty Shillings Current money to be paid by my Executors out of my
personal Estate he having received his full portion already.

Item I give and bequeath unto Patrick Riley the Sum of Ten
Shillings Current money to be paid by my Executors out of part of my
personal Estate he having received his full portion already.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Yeats one Cow and a
Colt and the third part of my Sheep to her and her Heirs and Assigns for
ever. Item I give and bequeath unto my Son James Anderson William
Mitchell and Mary Yeats all the remainder of my personal Estate to
be equally divided amongst them only allowing my Wife Jane Anderson
one Share according to Law to be held by them their Heirs and Assigns forever.

And lastly I do hereby ordain and appoint my well beloved Wife
Jane Anderson and James Anderson my Son my sole and sole Executors
of this my last Will and Testament disavowing revoking and making void all

Wills and Testaments or Legacies by me before made done or

of this my last will and testament disavowing revoking and making
all former and other wills and testaments or legacies by me before made or
committed. Be it my granting and confirming this to be my only last will and
