"FREE TRADE, SAILORS' RIGHTS, AND NO IMPRESSMENT."

Arrived yesterday morning, in 23 days from Boston, two waggons; one of which was navigated by four oxen and one horse, and the other by two oxen and three horses, commanded by captains —; crew on board, one white man and boy each—Cargo, cotton cards, tin ware, &c. &c. consigned to Prentiss & Carter, Wm. French and others. On their passage, touched at Philadelphia, and landed part of their cargo, consisting of itch ointment and some other notions. Saw none of his majesty's cruisers on the voyage, and found the road free from gun-boats, custom house officers, navy orders and all other obstructions to waggon enterprise. Spoke on their passage, two waggons, navigated by five horses each commanded by —, bound from Richmond, Virginia, to New York, 20 days out, under easy sail, cargo, plug tobacco, &c. all well.
