MEMORANDUM.

A meeting of the State Democratic Executive Committee has been called to meet in Richmond, on Wednesday, the 15th inst., to determine the policy to be pursued in the coming year.

The Convention should be held in Lynchburg, at a day as early as possible, and the party throughly re-organized for this fall campaign. A thorough and efficient reorganization is a necessity, and if properly planned and carried out will make possible a certain next November.

With a struggling organization there is no reason why the Democratic party should elect at least two-thirds of the next Legislature, and in fact will elect it. We know and understand full well that it takes work to do this. But the Democratic party has the men with the talent and energy necessary to do the work, and they are willing to do it, as has been demonstrated on many a former occasion, when called on to do so.

None but the very best men should be put forward in this fall, for the Senate and House of Delegates. There is much, infinitely more in men than anything else. Men inspire confidence and success by their manly, energetic and manly. With but poor selections as to candidates the best organizations will fail, but with proper and well selected candidates and thorough organization, we cannot fail to elect a majority of the next General Assembly.

A Democratic victory, this fall, means a great deal. It means the election of Mahone in the United States Senate, and thereby the re-opening of the people of this State. It means too that the rest of this State, in 1888, will be cast for the next Democratic candidate for the Presidency, without which he in all probability cannot be elected. STEWED RABBIT—To one pound rabbit, add a teaspoonful of pepper, salt to taste, and a little butter is freely; turn it once or twice in the cooking; turn the inside down. Steam for an hour, boiled low. When the rabbit is done, the liquid in the dish is well to have the shoulder brown before broiling. A touch of lamb or mutton will be a help.

STEWED RABBIT—To one pound rabbit, cut in pieces of one or two inches in length, add a teaspoonful of pepper, salt to taste, the grated rind of one lemon. Have ready a large saucepan of boiling water, throw the rabbit in and stir the pieces down with a wooden spoon. Put the cover on, and in three or four minutes it may be left, if the cover takes off, and the water is clear, the rabbit is done. If it is not, it is still in it. If it is done, it may be quietly turned in the sauce pan with a spoon so as not to break the rabbit. The water is left to boil for five minutes. The rabbit is then ready to eat. It may be left in the sauce pan for five minutes or less time, according to the weather. The rabbit is, of course, to be eaten with a sauce. 
