 testament that is to say principally and first of all
 I give and recommend my soul into the hand of

 at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but
 at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again
 by the almighty power of God. and as touching such
 worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless
 me in this life I give devise and dispose of the same
 in the following manner and form first I give and
 bequeath unto my dearly beloved wife Ann all my
 estate both real and personal and all the right and
 interest therein that I may legally part with to be hers
 during her natural life or while she remains my widow
 to live on use and keep as her own and after her
 decease or marriage if she should marry again
 then all my Property both real and personal that
 may at that time be left or remain in the possession
 of my wife is to go to the the Property and estate of
 my son Edwards Lucas. And as it respects the lands
 I live on if it be not conveyed by my son William
 Lucas in my life time to me as it ought to be or to
 my wife during her lifetime or widowhood then my
 son Edwards Lucas is to bring suit and recover the
 lands which is to be his and his heirs forever. I do
 hereby appoint my dearly beloved wife Ann Execu

 this my last will and Testament and I do hereby

devised and all my hogs sheep and geese and after the death of my wife the house is to be the property of my sons John and Charles Dingep and all the other property to be the property of my wife and to be disposed of as she may think proper. I also give to my wife my negro woman Juba as her own property.
