I Christopher Featherington of the county of Spotsylvania State of Virginia being sick and weak of body and of sound mind and disposing memory for which I thank God and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with, I give and bequeath the same in manner following that is to say first of all I give to wife Susanah the the land we now live on during her natural life and now and one cow together with household furniture, the personal estate at her death to dispose of at pleasure and after her death the land is to descend to my son Joseph Featherington and I also give to my son Joseph the Black Tracts together with Samuel Linsay having the privilege of doing his own works on them and no more - I also give to my son Joseph one still and one iron boiler and gear that belong to it - I also give to my daughter Betty Henderson two hundred dollars - I also give to my daughter Caty Featherington ten hundred dollars - I also give to my daughter Nancy Linsay the sum of two hundred dollars - The several sums mentioned is to be proportioned and paid equally to my three daughters as the money is collected - I also give to my son Joseph and Betsey Heifer - I also give to my daughter Nancy Linsay and Black Calf - I also give to my wife one other Heifer -

It will be understood also that Samuel Linsay is to have the privilege of the state to state his own price and no more And also the half of the Wagon - Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends John Hafford and Joseph Featherington of the county of Spotsylvania

Executing of this my last will and testament by me hereunto made in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 17th day of October 1822
