Christian L Snidow of the County of Giles and State of Virginia do hereby make my last will and Testament in manner and form following to wit

First I desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid
Secondly I desire that my executor hereafter named shall sell all my perishable property except my negroes, and after paying all my just debts that he divide the balance of the proceeds of said sale equally between my wife Barbara, and my two sons William H H and George

Thirdly I give all my real estate consisting of the home plantations, and two other tracts known by the name of the Ford plantations and also my three negroes Sam Juditer and Betsy, to my wife and my two sons before mentioned. To my wife, the one third of said estate during her natural life, and after death, that portion of my estate devised to her is to descend to my two sons, and to be equally divided between them.

Fourthly I give to my executor, with the consent of my wife should they think it proper to do so, the power of renting, both my tracts of land and my interest in the Ferry, and also to hire my negroes until my oldest son attains the age of twenty one years, and the proceeds of said rent and hire to be equally divided between my wife and my two sons, by giving to each one third.

Fifthly I desire that my Executor remain with my wife during the present season, and manage my Farms, ferry and all my other business for which (if he can do so he must be paid a fair and reasonable compensation)

And lastly I do hereby appoint George Snidow for Executor of this my last will and Testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 3rd day of April 1843

That is to say I desire & request my Executors to reserve out of the rents of my lands devised to my children the sum of two hundred dollars to be paid by them to my adopted daughter Elvira Virginia Walker on her coming to the age of eighteen years, & in the event of her not living at that age the said sum to remain as part of Estate, as will be hereafter.
