

After deducting the sum paid out by the Executors from the amount of the Estate they remain in the hands of the Executors \$569.23 $\frac{1}{2}$ there being seven heirs which causes that sum to be divided into seven equal parts each part worth \$81.31 which is the legacy coming to each heir
