Pursuant to an order of the County Court made at the 1st of
 October Monthly term appointing the unexecuted Commission
 made by me, a copy to Elizabeth Henry witness of the following
 that I have heretofore agreed to give in other field of land
 lying on the East side of his farm containing 36 acres, and also
 so much of my old survey as is included in the following bounds
 as set Beginning at the old line at the branch between my
 house and Christian Link and with the fence down the branch
 running directly through the land.

Sixtly I Give and bequeath to my son Christian Link
 and Henry Link my negro and every thing appertaining
 thereto, my Smith tools are to remain as the plantation
 (which she now uses) and each of my three sons are to have
 an equal interest in her and slooche time as it servis
 to my self.

Thirdly I Give to my son William all the land I purchase
 ed from William & Lewis lying on Sinking Creek the be
 ing the land wherein the said William Link now resides.

Fourthly I Give to my wife Mary my Wifes man named
 Bob two work horses his mitch Cows or choice of the Cows
 One half of my flock of hogs this has since their marriage
 and the last chance of my hogs I Give to my son Henry and
 at the decease of my wife I also give to my son Henry
 my negro man Bob and all the other personal property and
 my plantation at the death of my wife and none of my
 property is to be sold by executors.

Fifthly I Give to my son Henry Link for the benefit of
 my Daugher Polly Summerfield Daugher Henry whom she
 got married the following tract of land begining at the corner
 of the Coopers fence where it meets ^{crosses} a particular line then
 or with the same a north corner to Abundine line thence an
 easterly course and opposite to the beginning goes to
 make a Direct line following a crooked fence at the Beginning
 But the Henry Summerfield is to receive no property ^{or} in
 rest of the said land until the said marriage.

Sixtly I Give to my Daugher Catherine Anne Bottler to
 be paid her by my Executors

Seventy I Give to my son Henry all other land I own
 not heretofore devised to my sons Christian & William
 and my son Henry for the benefit of my Daugher Polly
 Summerfield Daugher Mary

and all my money and all debts that may become
 to me at my death together with my other property
 that may be in the plantation at the death of my
 wife Elizabeth. I Give to my Daugher Elizabeth

come before you to make and declare this my last will &
testament in manner and form following:

I bid I resign my soul to God hoping and believing in a remission
of my sins by his grace and mercies of your Christ and my
body I commit to the Earth to be buried at the discretion of
my executors herein of my mind and my worldly estate I give
and devise as follows:

I bid I give and devise to George C. Trout the tract of Land
now leased and in the occupancy of William Estelle previous
to his said Trout for certain other bequests hereof mentioned
of said Trout shall suffice to take the Land and such sum as
the land is to be taken at public sale and the process is to
apply as shall be hereafter mentioned also I give unto
Henry Trout son of George C. Trout the sum of One hundred
dollars also I give to Elizabeth Trout daughter of George
C. Trout the sum of One Hundred dollars also I give to
George W. Trout son of George C. Trout the sum of One
hundred dollars also I give to Mary Harriet Trout daughter
of George C. Trout the sum of One hundred dollars

I also give to Mary Trout daughter of George C. Trout
the sum of One hundred dollars also I give to John W. Trout son of
George C. Trout the sum of One hundred dollars also I give
to Anna Trout wife of George C. Trout the sum of One hundred
dollars also whereas James Reynolds is indebted to me one hundred
and sixpence account the whole amount of which I pay and be
bound to the said James Reynolds

I give and bequeath to my lawful heirs the sum
of One hundred Dollars and finally all the rest residue and
remainder of my estate and effects real and personal whatsoever
and wheresoever not herein before especially comprised of after pay
ment of debts legacies and funeral expenses and other charges and
expenditures as aforesaid I do give and devise and bequeath to
George C. Trout

Also that my executors pay the aforesaid Legacies to the Legatees
as they become of Lawful age to Mary and I do hereby appre
int George C. Trout my sole executor of this my last will
and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made
in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
the twenty third day of May in the year of our Lord
One thousand Eight hundred and forty four
