I Thomas Allen of the County of Giles being sick and weak in
 body but of sound mind and disposing memory for which I thank God
 am willing to make the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to
 dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with
 I hereby give unto my wife and daughter Sally Shannon all that I have
 for negroes my wife's birth and marriage all this I give unto her during
 her natural life and further I give and bequeath unto her the back shed
 Room and Room up stairs with a fire place in and all the house hold furniture
 of all kinds except that may be more specially named here after and also all the
 Kitchen furniture in the same way as the household furniture we left and also
 I give her four shares of land and a black pig the cattle sheep and hogs one
 hundred and thirty two shares of horse and one third part of the
 Wagon and it my will and desire that the household furniture and Kitchen
 furniture horse cattle sheep and hogs as above mentioned to be at her will to
 dispose of them at her death as she may think proper and it is my will and
 desire that my wife and my son William Allen pay my daughter Sally Shannon
 one hundred dollars within two years after my decease in property
 I give unto my son William Allen the horse patentation to him and his heirs
 for ever and also a small parcel of Land lying on the north side of the
 Wagon Road purchase of Ephraim Dumberland and one negro boy and Henry
 and one half of my estate after Eliza receives her part and half my hogs and
 two thirds of the Wagon and all the Gear the South side of all my farming land
 of all kinds and some furniture and two Hares
 I give to my daughter Eliza Allen one Saddle Horse and one Bitch Eight
 hundred Colts three Doves & furniture and household linen and table and bed
 and kitchen furniture she is to have out of my house to make her equal
 with my daughter Sally Shannon and also that part of land
 bought of Ephraim Dumberland and name by the Cockay place and one
 negro Girl named Lavinia
 It is my will and desire that the negroes left to my wife is to be
 equally divided among my four children at their mother's death

6th I give to my daughter Sally Shannon that back shed that is now under
 parcel including the water that is now within the same fence
 7th It is my will and desire that my wife and my son William Allen pay all my
 Just debts and funeral expenses
 8th that all that my daughter Sally Shannon has all ready received of me
 I give unto her and her heirs for ever
 9th Am a sacred thought to make my children more safe and to make
 the first section of my will more plain to the under stand. It is my will
 and desire that my wife is to have the property mentioned in the first section
 with this reserve that is to say if she shall change her way of living and marry
 them in that case she is not to have that property to do as she please with
 but at her death that property is to be equally divided among my natural
 children and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends my
 wife Sally Allen Thomas Shannon and my son William Allen Executors
 of my last will and Testament hereby revoking all other or former
 wills or testaments by me here before made in writing whereof I have
 here unto set my hand and affixed my seal this 28th day of June in
 the year of our Lord 1831

This last will and testament of Thomas Allen was returned into
 Court and proved by the oaths of the witnesses Charles King James Bone and Thomas Rankin their Executors signed
 and acknowledged their name in the presence of five thousand dollars four both in presence
 Thomas Allen

 Consideration of the love good will and affection which I have and have towards
 my loving daughter Eliza A. Allen of the same County and off and
 have given and granted and by these presents do freely give and grant unto the
 said Eliza A. Allen her heirs Executors or Assigns a Black boy and white
 about Eight years old named Nedde now living in my possession of about
 before the signing of these presents I have delivered her the same Eliza A. Allen
 the above named child Eliza with my own hand and even having made known
 and to have that said Negro child named Nedde in witness whereof I have hereunto
 put my hand and seal this 9th day of March 1831
