Facts - David French C.S.

Testament of Thomas Allen of the County of Giles being sick and weak in
body but of sound mind and disposing memory for which I thank God
and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to
dispense of all such worldly Estates as I hold please God to bless me with
I do therefore by these presents make my will as follows -
I do bequeath to my daughter Eliza Allent the house of the name plantation also I give her
for negro boy Wesley birth over March all this a house & give unto her during
her natural life and further I give and bequeath unto her the Black Shed
Room and Room up stairs with a fire place in and all the house hold furniture
of all kinds except that may be necessary specially named her after and also all the
Kitchen furniture in the same way as the house hold furniture is left and also
I do give her four acres of land on a creek of the name plantation also I give her
land in place and shall two pairs of horse teams and one third part of the
Wagon and as my will and desire that the house hold furniture and kitchen
furniture horses cattle sheep and hogs a slave sometimes is to be at his will to
disposse of them at his death as follows then to my son William Allent it is my will and
desire that my wife and my son William Allent pay my daughter Eliza Allent
one hundred dollars within two years of my decease in property
3rd I give unto my son William Allent the house plantation to him and his heirs
for ever and also a small parcel of land lying on the north side of the
Wagon room junction of Ephraim Number 100th and one negro boy and hony
and one half of my cattle of ten Eliza receive her part and half my hogs and
two thirds of the wagon and all the gear the south two acres all my farmings land
of all kinds are her and furniture and two slaves
4th I give to my daughter Eliza Allent one Black mare to ride & Bridle Eight
horses of cattle three pens & furniture bedding harness and table cutlery
and kitchen furniture she is to have out of my house to make her equal
with my daughter Eliza and Sally Shannon and also that part of land
bought of Ephraim Number and name by the Cockeys place and one
Negro girl name Lavinia
5th It is my will and desire that the negro left to my wife is to be
equally divided among my four children at their mothers death

6th I give to my daughter Eliza Allent that house built there that is situated
near including the water that is over within the same fence
7th It is my will and desire that any wife or any daughter of Eliza Allent pay all my
last debts and funeral expenses
8th that all that my daughter Sally Shannon has already received of me
I give unto her and her heirs for ever
9th On a second thought to make my children more safe and to make
the first section of my will more plain to be under stood it is my will
and desire that my wife to have the property mentioned in the first section
with this reserve that is to say if she shall change her way of living among
them in that case she is not to have that property to her as the pleasure will be
but at her death that property is to be equally divided among my several
children and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends my
wife Sally Allent Thomas Shannon and my son William Allent Executors
of my last will and Testament hereby revoking all other or former
will or testament by me heretofore made in writing whereof here
hereunto set my hand and affix my seal this 20th day of June in
the year of our Lord 1829

This last will and testament of Thomas Allent 1829 was returned into

house given and granted and by these presents do freely give and grant unto the
said Eliza Allent her heirs executors and administrators a Black boy child
about eight years the above named Nedde now living in my possession of which
before the signing of these presents I have delivered her the said Eliza Allent
the above named Child I give with my own hand and cause leaving out those
one to believe that the Negro Child named Nedde in witness whereof I have caused
put my hand and seal this 17th day of March 1831

This deed of gift from Thomas to Eliza B. Allen for one
