I George W. Peas of Giles County Virginia being
in a bad State of bodily health but of sound & clear
mind do make this my last will and
testament.

In the first place I desire that it be known & known
hereinafter that of the debts & after the pay-
ment of the funeral expenses I direct that all my
just debt shall be paid and in order to enable
my executors & Executrix herein after named to
pay my debts I direct & authorize them or as
many of them to sell all the lands of which
I have a right to dispose of in manner directed to
hereby fully authorizing them to make titles to
said lands or lands & to apply the proceeds of
said lands to the payment of my just debts
& should the land prove to be sufficient for the pur-
pose then that they sell any of my personal
property including the slaves if they should
think it most advisable so to do or it should
prove necessary for the payment of my debts
& after paying all my just debts the surplus
to be apportioned by valuation of my property &
which my executors as executors might think ad-
visable not to sell or by the same as above stated
surplus after deducting the one third & dividing
the balance by the number of my children
one to be found that my daughter
Nancy A. Edgar has received more than her
proportion as above in a black girl weighed
nearly at three hundred & fifty dollars a horse
a saddle & bridle at sixty dollars & two horses
at fifty dollars amounting to \$460 in that

case that said Edgar is to pay back so much
her as my children equal & direct after the pay-
ment of my debts the surplus that might remain
agreeable to the above arrangement should
be laid out in the purchase of a farm for
any wife & children I give to her all my prop-
erty of every description that is now in my
possession & the surplus remaining after the
payment of my just debt together with any
debt owing to me to be used as I have direc-
ted to the purchase of a farm by myself
or executors and Executrix or a majority of them the
title of said farm to be made to my wife during
her life or widowhood and my several children
to wit George W. Peas, Robert, C. Peas, Daniel
M. Peas, Elizabeth, Ann Peas & Adela C. Peas
with all my children including Daniel M.
Peas down to his as well educated by my execu-
tors & executrix as far as possible
will all to my wife to have the use of the
farm to be purchased & all other property of any
kind during her life or while she may remain
single & in the event of her marriage or death
the land and property if any to be equally dis-
tributed among my several children to wit
(name) It is to be some enquest with the
remaining children taking into consideration
what she has already received agreeable to the
above arrangement and should my wife man-
age to have nothing but what the law
will allow but I wishing executors and execu-
tress to manage my estate in the best possible
manner to carry into effect my will lastly
I appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth H. Peas
my Executrix & my son George W. Peas and
John A. B. George my Executrix to carry into
effect the various provisions of this will

on the 25th day of February 1835
