I George A. Paine of Giles County Virginia being
in a bad State of bodily health but of sound & clear
mind hereby make this my last will and
testament.

In the first place I direct that my body be
buried decently having of late been afflicted with the pay-
ment of the funeral expenses I direct that all my
just debts shall be paid and in order to enable
my executors & Executors herein after named to
pay my debts I direct & authorize them or a
majority of them to sell all the lands of which
I am or may be seised in fee simple and I
hereby fully authorizing them to make title to
said lands or lands to be applied the proceeds of
said lands to the payment of my just debts
& should the land prove insufficient for the pur-
pose then that they sell any of my personal
property including the slaves if they should
think most advisable so to do as it should
prove necessary if the payment of my debts
after paying all my just debts the surplus
to be apportioned by valuation of my property
which my executors or executors might think ad-
visable not to sell or by the sale as above which
surplus after deducting the one third & dividing
the balance by the number of my children
save one I should be found that my daughter
Nancy A. Edgall had received more than her
proportion as above in a black girl which I
will at three hundred & fifty dollars a horse
& saddle & buggy at sixty dollars & two head of cattle
three at fifty dollars amounting to \$460 in this

case the said Edgall is to pay back so as to ma-
ke all my children equal & direct after the pay-
ment of my debts the surplus that might remain
agreeable to the above arrangement should
be laid out in the purchase of a farm for
my wife & children & give to her all my prop-
erty of every description that is mine or my
possession or the surplus remaining after the
payment of my just debts together with any
debts owing to her to be used as I have before
directed to the purchase of a farm by my ex-
ecutors and Executors and majority of them the
title of said farm to be made to my wife during
her life or widow-hood and my several children
to wit George W. Paine Rebecca A. Paine Daniel
St Paine Elizabeth Ann Paine & Adela Paine
I wish all my children including Daniel St
Paine down to her as well educated by my ex-
ecutors & Executors each one of the said
will allow my wife to have the use of the
farm to be purchased & all other property of any
kind during her life or while she may remain
single & in the event of her marriage or death
the land and property if any to be equally di-
vided among my several children & will
I direct that my said wife & my children
remaining children taking into consideration
what she has already received agreeable to the
before arrangement and should my wife ma-
rily then to have nothing but what the law
will allow her I wish my executors and ex-
ecutors to manage my estate in the best possible
manner to carry into effect my will lastly
I appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth St Paine
my Executors & my son George W. Paine and
John B. George my Executors to carry into
effect the various provisions of this will.
