In the name of God Amen I George Chapman of the County of Floyd and State of Kentucky being sick and weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory (for which I thank God) and calling to mind the mortality uncertainty of human life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly Estate as I have Pleased God to bless me with I give and bequeath the Same in the manner following that is to say first I desire that all my perishable property be appraised and so much of it sold as may be necessary to pay all my last debts and funeral Expenses the balance or so much thereof as my wife may think necessary to retain is to be hers during her natural life and after her death it is to be Equally divided among all my Children I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife Paliene that part of my tract of Land lying & being in the County of Floyd on Sandy river that is known by the name of the of the round hollow it being that part of the tract of Land on which I intended to settle to have and to hold the Same during her natural life and at her decease my will is that all that part of the tract of Land hereby willed to my wife is to be Equally divided between my two Sons David & George agreeable to quantity and quality to have and to hold the the Same to them and their heirs forever I further desire that Isaac Chapman David the nephew Solomon

purchase a negro girl out of the money they are owing me which negro girl I will at bequeath unto my wife during her life natural life and after the death of my wife the said negro girl and her increase if any is to be sold & the money arising from the Sale is to be Equally divided among all my Children my will is that my Son Archabald & Isaac and my son in law Joseph Peck pay to my Estate one hundred dollars each being money I have paid for them and on them doing so then the balance of my Land lying on Sandy river not already disposed of is to be Equally divided among all my Children my Son David & George Excepted and the said share of money paid by my Son Archabald & Isaac and my son in law Joseph Peck is to be equally divided among all my children I will & bequeath unto John Chapman a Son which Elizabeth Jackson had before she was married my Sarah more & ten dollars in cash being the amount I intend for him out of my Estate I further desire that fifty acres of Land I have lying & being in the County of Giles in Virginia on new river at the mouth of Loch hollow be sold by my Executors herein after named for the best price they can get for the Same and the proceeds of the Sale to be Equally divided among all my Children my desire is that my Executors herein after named cause a good Education to be given to my Son David & George which they are to pay for out of my Estate lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my Friend William Chapman of the County of Giles (Virginia) & Joseph Peck of the County of Floyd Kentucky Executors of this my last will and testament by me here before made In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 20th day of April in the year of our Lord 1816
