last will
and testament

In the name of God Amen I George Hughes of the County of Giles and State of Virginia being sick weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory for which I thank God and casting to mind the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to dispose of such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bestow on me with I do hereby make my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say I give and bequeath my soul to God who gave it and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent and Christian like manner. I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Margaret one feather bed bedstead and furniture One black mare and one gray filly fifteen head of sheep and all my stock of hogs and one Brown Cow one mottled face Cow and one pided Cow and pided heifer and all the farming utensils and my flock of geese and all my bee hives and all the household and kitchen furniture also the plantation whereon I now live during her life and after her decease the said plantation to be sold and the money equal divided between me for my wife I give and bequeath unto my son

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Thomas all my wearing counter that I do possess of I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Hughes one spotted horse and one spotted bed bedstead and furniture I also give and bequeath unto my daughter Hannah Colwell one coffee Curn with its appurtenances I also give and bequeath unto my son David Hughes one feather bed and furniture and one bundle corn with a white sack I also give and bequeath unto my son George Hughes one feather bed and furniture and ^{twenty dollars} one head heifer I also give and bequeath unto my daughter Polly Hughes one feather head bedstead and furniture and bundle corn I also give and bequeath unto my son John Hughes one Bay filly and my saddle and one bundle heifer one feather head and furniture I also give and bequeath unto my daughter Margaret Hughes one barrel filly and one cow and calf one head feather head and furniture I also give and bequeath unto my daughter Betty Polly Hughes one barrel Colt and one pided heifer one feather head and furniture I also desire that my wife Margaret to pay all my just debts out of her part of the estate and receive all that is due I hereby constitute and appoint David Johnston and John Merry Executors of this my last will and Testament I hereby revoke all other former wills or testaments by me heretofore made I hereby empower and request my said executors to sell and convey according to law my said plantation at the desire of my wife Margaret in testimony whereof I have set my hand and seal this 11th day of June 1827.
