 of my body and knowing it is appointed for all men to die
 do make and ordain this my last will and Testament that is
 to say first of all I Give and recommends my soul unto the hand
 of Almighty God, ^{who gave it} and my body I recommend to the Earth
 to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of
 my Executors, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection
 I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God
 and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it pleases
 God, to bless me in this life I demise bequeath and dispose
 of the same in the manner and form following Viz first
 all my just debts to be paid out of any money or levied out
 of my property. I give and bequeath unto my well beloved
 Granddaughter Ida Neely four head of horses to be sold
 by my Executors on a common credit and when collected
 to be laid out by them on interest and at her lawful
 age to receive the same and enjoy it for ever I also
 give and bequeath unto my well beloved children
 and heirs Viz James Neely Belay Neely Matty Neely
 and John Neely the land I now live on to be equally
 divided between them also all my money debts horses
 (not heretofore devised) cattle sheep &c together with
 all the property and articles not specially named
 in this my last will and Testament to be equally
 divided between my before mentioned four children
 and heirs to be enjoyed by them forever and I do constitute
 and appoint William Smith and James McLaugherty
 the sole Executors of this my last will and Testament
 and do utterly revoke and disannul all former legacies bequests
 wills and Testaments heretofore by me in any wise made

owning and declaring this and no other to be my last will
 and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
 hand this 7th day of September 1825
