mind the uncertainty of Human life & being, desirous to dispose
of all such worldly Estate, as it hath pleased God to bless me
with, I dispose, of the same in the manner & form following
that is to say First I desire that all my Cattle sheep & hogs
Except those here in after Excepted be Immediately sold
after my decease by my Executors here after named for the best
price & out of the monies arising therefrom all my just debts &
funeral Expenses be paid. Secondly After the payment of my
debts & funeral Expenses I give to my beloved wife Nancy Truitt
all my real Estate whereon I now live to be freely Enjoyed &
occupied by her during her Natural life time together with all
my house hold, & kitchen furniture, also my Waggon Harnessing
& three work horses namely Mike Charles & Joe also one bay mare
colored doll & all my farming materials one Mill & Reapers
then unto belonging five milk cows ten head of sheep one set of
smith tools permitting my sons to do work therewith as they may re-
quire also such quantity of hogs of my present stock to be reser-
ved from the sale, above mentioned what may be thought
necessary for the consumption of my family untill made aware
for that purpose. also, about one thousand eight hundred & fifty
dollars, also two notes on Robert Hunter nineteen dollars, also
one on Mr Taylor \$19 to be retained in the hands of my said wife
for the payment of any claims against my said Estate she may
think proper to defray therewith to save other property or retain
the same as she may think best Thirdly After her decease I
give & bequeath to my son William Truitt, all that tract or parcel
of Land whereon I now live lying in Giles County

containing by Survey three hundred & Eighty six Acres
be the same more or less to be fully & freely Enjoyed by him
& his heirs forever, also one small House called Brandy to be his
and from this date I also my rifle gun to be his forever Fourthly
I give and bequeath to my son George Truitt, a certain tract
or parcel of Land, known by the Name of Eagles place lying
in Giles County, adjoining John Lowery containing by Survey two
hundred & ten acres be the same more or less, also fifty acres by
Survey be the same more or less, being, and Inting a joining the
above two hundred & ten acres in all two Hundred & twenty acres to be
fully & freely Enjoyed by him & his heirs forever, also those head of horse
beasts which he hath now in possession & all those horses to him
& his heirs forever. Fifthly I give to my daughter Polly Gallwele
twelve dollars out of what she hath received of me her father to be
Levied, and paid out of the part of the Estate designed to be sold
the same, all to be freely Enjoyed by her & her heirs forever
Sixthly I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Truitt and young Col
which she hath heretofore claimed, also two Seventhly I give to
my daughter Susanna Truitt two cows & calves which she hath heretofore
claimed Eighthly I give to my daughter Nancy Truitt one
cow which she hath heretofore claimed Ninthly I give to my
daughter Barbary Truitt one cow which she hath heretofore claimed
Tenthly I desire that my Executors herein named do sell my
Claims to real Estate in John Davis for the best price that may
be obtained & the monies arising therefrom to be Equally divided betwixt
and my four Daughters last named I desire that one mare be sold
and the proceeds continued on plantation with my wife for the purpose
of Encouragement for the benefit of my four Daughters last named to be
disposed of as their Mother together with other articles left her may think
proper to distribute to them at her decease or before as she may think
best to promote their welfare

Myself. All the rest of my estate both real and personal
 of whatever nature or kind it may be and having particularly
 disposed of I have now equally divided between my
 several English last mentioned names Elizabeth, Anne
 Mary & Barbara - which together with the other estate
 particular mentioned I give to them & their heirs forever
 And lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint my friend
 John Knight Trustee of this my last will and
 testament fully executing all former wills or testaments
 by me heretofore made - In witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the first day
 of May in the year of Christ Eighteen hundred and ninth
