of securing a debt of twenty five pounds due by  
account also seven pounds four shillings and  
three Pence part of a note Assigned by Adams  
Christman to Jacob Peck H<sup>c</sup> which sums I justly  
owe to said Jacob Peck H<sup>c</sup> and in further  
consideration of the sum of five shillings in hand  
paid to me by John Peck a member of said firm  
have this day Assigned my right and title to  
my house and Lot in Parisburg with all its ap-  
purtenances and Conveniences thereto belonging  
together with all my household furniture to

two feather beds and furniture two benches one chest  
two tables two pots one oven one washing tub two  
pails one bucket one fire shovel one bare pot hooks  
one frying pan three tin pans two Brass kettles  
sticks two coffee pots two looking glasses four  
chairs some tea cups and saucers plates knives  
forks bowls glass Tumblers Tea spoons Table spoons  
one tea pot two dishes one Turin one Tea Kettle  
two Smoothing Irons one Spinning wheel one side  
saddle three flower Casks one Grindstone one  
violin also Iron pot rack which I have this day  
granted bargained sold and delivered by these pre-  
sents do grant bargain sell and deliver warrant  
and defend from all claims whatsoever unto the  
said Jacob Beck & Co upon Condition that if the  
said Henry Smith do pay or Cause to be paid  
unto the said J. Beck & Co the above sums with  
Interest from this date within six months then  
this conveyance to be void otherwise to remain in  
full force Given under my hand & Seal this fifth  
day of April 1809.

affection which I have for my daughter Judith  
Niewonder And for and in Consideration of

the farther sum of two dollars to me in hand paid  
before the executing and delivery of these presents  
the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge have this  
day bargained and sold unto the said Judith  
Niewonder and her heirs and assigns forever a  
negro man slave named Mingo about twenty  
years of age the title of said Negro I do warrant  
and defend against me or my heirs or any claim-  
ing under through or by me or any claiming under  
or by the last will and Testament of Thomas  
Farley dec'd by which I the said Judith Farley  
acquired my title But it is expressly agreed and  
understood that the said Judith Farley is to retain  
the said negro man Mingo in her possession during  
the natural life of her the said Judith Farley &  
to have and enjoy the use and benefit of the  
labour of the said Negro for the time aforesaid  
of her natural life, at which Period to come into  
the possession of the said Niewonder And the  
said Niewonder is to be at the request of the  
life of the said Negro As Witness my hand &  
Seal this 9<sup>th</sup> day of Septe 1809
