 I Isaiahs Grimes of the county of Giles and state of  
 Virginia being very sick and frail in body but of sound  
 mind and memory and knowing that it is appinted for man  
 once to die, I do make this my last will and testament  
 In the first place I desire that after my death my body be  
 buried in a decent Christian like manner at the discretion  
 of my Executrix, hereafter named and my soul I resign to  
 God who gave it and acknowledging such earthly estate and both  
 felawnd God to help me with over and above what I have alre  
 ady disposed of I do dispose of in the following manner to wit  
 I do give and bequeath unto my son Daniel the following part of  
 my lands and tenements Beginning at a rock well known  
 to be a cross allured for him William & James Grimes and  
 running hence \$65 N 55 deg to a stake by the side of a

and Meadow thence \$38.69 feet up ad Meadow thence \$37.60 feet  
at Meadow 94 feet to a chestnut sprout by a fence thence \$36.20 poles  
thence \$33.40 feet to a large of rocks across a branch thence  
\$31.025 feet to a hickory sprout thence \$34.70 feet to a walnut -  
on a ridge thence \$37.63 poles to a walnut thence \$22.025  
feet to my outside line to a state thence with said line at 40  
degrees to a chestnut oak white oak and water oak on the  
top of the mountain thence down the mountain \$32.1000 feet  
to a chestnut oak by a path and water oak thence \$35.60 15 feet  
to the beginning. And I give and bequeath to my son Will  
James Givens as follows beginning at the top of the mountain  
at Daniels corner and with his lines to the west known as old  
above named thence with a dividing line between him and  
James Givens leaving Daniels line at 38 feet 48 poles to a corner  
in a lane bearing round with the bend of the lane meeting  
the line the line whence \$45.10 35 feet to a white oak by  
a ledge of rocks thence \$30.10 60 feet to a large white oak &  
ash thence \$39.10 60 poles to a white oak on my out line  
and also Williams line and Williams fence and thence with  
my out lines to the beginning including all that part of land  
that lies the said Williams Givens more lies as above and  
less and I give and bequeath unto my son James Givens  
from the root running with Williams Givens line down to my  
out line and Williams line and running with my out line  
including and passing his house and also passing a corner of  
George Webb's land 100 poles to a chestnut oak and thence bearing  
the line and division between him and my son Lloyd Givens  
and running South 65 & 70 degrees to a red oak near the way  
you road whence \$36.056 feet to a red oak back near the road  
thence \$44.650 poles through a field and passing a corner on  
said field to a state on Daniels line near a nutmeg Walnut  
grown by a former owner bearing Lloyd's line and with Daniels  
line to the beginning at the north corner before named and  
the balance of my land lying out of said lines I give and be  
queath to my son Lloyd Givens and I have already given to  
my son John Givens what I intended to give him with the excep  
tion of one dollar which is to be paid out of my goods chattels  
and monies not yet earned and I give unto my five daughters  
Sally Cokerwell one dollar and each her daughter one fifth  
part of the residue of my estate directed to be sold or not  
mentioned in this my last will and Testament and unto my  
other four daughters Peggy Johnson and Sally Park Ogleby  
Smith and Anna Reynolds to be made equal. Counting what  
I have already given to them that I have already given and  
is remaining those that has lost the least to be made equal  
to the others. Let the record and seal be done.

to be divided between my 4 last named daughters and Peggy  
Daughters and I give to my grand daughter Sabine Daniels  
daughter one good bed and bed clothes and I give unto my  
wife Peggy Givens the balance of the bed and household  
and kitchen furniture and choice of horses while she lives  
and for Floyd to keep and maintain her in a decent and  
Christianlike manner while she lives and after her death  
to be sold and disposed of as above named by my exec  
utors hereafter named and all such property as my wife  
has no use for to be sold soon after my death so lastly  
I do appoint Wilkinson Givens and Wilkinson Reynolds my  
executors to this my last will and Testament. Given under  
my hand and seal this 21<sup>st</sup> of July 1847.
