 I Isaiah Simeon of the county of Giles and state of
 Virginia being very sick and frail in body but of sound
 mind and memory and knowing that it is appointed for man
 once to die, I do make this my last will and testament
 In the first place I desire that after my death my body be
 buried in a decent Christian like manner at the discretion
 of my Executors hereafter named and my soul I resign to
 God who gave it and restoring such worldly estate and half
 interest of I do dispose of in the following manner to wit
 I do give and bequeath unto my son Daniel the following part of
 my lands and tenements Beginning at a tract well known
 to be a corner allowed for him Williams & James Greene and
 running thence S 21° 55' E a distance by the side of

and Mason three S 30 E 9 po up to Mason three S 27 W 10 po
 St. Mason 90 po to a Chestnut spruce by a fence three S 36 E 30 po
 three S 33 West 10 po to a large of rocks and a birch three
 N 31 E 25 po to a birch spruce three S 33 E 30 po to a Walnut
 on a ridge three S 37 E 35 po to a Walnut three S 32 E 33
 poles to my outside line to a stake three with 30 line N 30
 E 123 po to a Chestnut Oak white Oak and Water Oak on the
 top of the mountain three down the mountain N 22 W 30 po
 to S Chestnut Oak by a path and Water Oak three N 35 W 137 po
 to the Beginning. And I give and bequeath to my son Will
 iam James as follows beginning at the top of the Mountain
 at Daniels Corner and with his line to the well known rock
 above named three with a dividing line between him and
 James James leaving Daniels line N 35 W 45 poles to a large
 in a line having round with the head of the tree meeting
 the line the line three N 45 W 35 po to a white oak by
 a ledge of rocks three S 30 W 6 po to a large white Oak &
 oak three N 37 W 60 poles to a white Oak on my out line
 and also Williams line and Williams fence and three with
 my out line to the beginning including all that part of land
 that lies the said Williams James now lies on above said
 line and I give and bequeath unto my son James James
 from St. rock running with Williams James line down to my
 out line and Williams line and running with my out line
 including and passing his house and also passing a corner of
 George Webb's lot N 30 poles to a Chestnut Oak and three leaving
 the line and dividing between him and my son Floyd James
 and running South 65 E 70 poles to a red Oak near the long
 road three N 36 E 56 po to a red Oak back near a road
 three N 46 E 60 poles through a field and passing a corner on
 said field to a stake on Daniels line near a small Walnut
 fence by a fence three leaving Floyd's line and with Daniels
 line to the beginning at the rock corner before named and
 the balance of my land lying out of it I give and be
 queath to my son Floyd James and I have already given to
 my son John James what I intended to give him with the rest
 of one dollar which is to be paid out of my goods chattels
 and monies not yet named and I give unto my free daughter
 Mary Caldwell one dollar and more her 2 daughters and fifth
 part of the residue of my estate to be sold or not
 mentioned in this my last will and Testament and unto my
 other four daughters Peggy Johnston and Sally Johnston
 and Anna Reynolds to be made equal counting what
 I have already given to them that I have already given to
 is meaning those that has had the best to be made equal to
 the same but the same and from the balance

to be divided between my 4 last named daughters and Peggy
 daughters and I give to my grand daughter Abeline Daniels
 daughter one good bed and bed clothes and I give unto my
 wife Peggy James the balance of the line and household
 and kitchen furniture and choice of horses while she lives
 and for Floyd to keep and maintain her in a decent and
 Christianlike manner while she lives and after her death
 to be sold and disposed of as above named by my Exe
 cutors hereafter named and all such property as my wife
 has no use for to be sold soon after my death and lastly
 I do appoint William James and William Reynolds my
 Executors to this my last will and Testament given under
 my hand and seal this 21st of July 1867.
