

My Executors to convey to David Johnston such lands as has fallen to him in a partition of land between us by an agreement in writing set the title to which has not been conveyed to him and my Executor is hereby authorized to convey the same. And whereas I own two old and full slaves to wit John & Melly who are to form an exception to the course I have directed to be taken as all my other slaves I wish them lands kept under the care of my Executors and not put out to labour I wish a small cabin to be built for them in what is called in Thos Field and one acre of land below added to Said Field & which land is to be cultivated by them out of which they are to have their support so far as it may go with a milk cow which is to be placed there for their use and the balance of their support to come out of my estate I have money in my possession belonging to James H. Watson of New York and also money belonging to Alfred Hyatt of Rockbridge County which money I wish my Executors to convey to the person to whom it belongs my Executors are requested to furnish my daughter Polly Anna and Eliza Stines and my Son Andrew Henderson each with a calf at the price they may be appraised at if they or either of them shall wish to have a calf in that way the choice of both to give the oldest first I wish my Executors to send my Son Andrew Henderson at least two Sessions to a Latin School in Fincastle or to some other good School at some other place the price of which is to be taken out of his share of my estate lastly I do hereby appoint my worthy friends Ish. Henderson & James Chapman & Johnston Executors of this my last will and Testament and I do ratify this and acknowledge it to be my true last will and Testament and do revoke annuls and make void all other and former wills and Testaments in any wise heretofore willed or made for testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 3rd day of November in the year of our Lord 1838

Whereas I Andrew Johnston of the County of Giles did make my last will and testament on the 3rd day of November 1838 and sign acknowledged the same and desirous to make some slight alterations therein and being of sound mind and disposing memory desire that this shall be considered and received as a Codicil to my said will In my said will I devised to my Sons Andrew H. Johnston and James David Johnston my river tract of land and fifty acres of my Town tract of land now instead of the said fifty acres of my Town tract of land I do will & devise to my said Sons Andrew & James David fifty five acres of my Town tract to be divided as shall find in my said will of the 3rd.

of November 1838 & whereas the sum of \$2000 & Andrew Johnston exceeded the 2nd of March 1837 a bond to Mary Henderson now deceased for the sum of One hundred and fifty dollars payable on demand upon which bond there are various credits & whereas the Said Mary Henderson on the 3rd of November 1833 assigned the same to my beloved wife Jane Johnston & I do hereby declare that the said bond is not to be considered as any part of my estate but belongs to and is to be retained by my Said wife Jane Johnston & my Executors in my Said will of the 3rd of November 1838 are to set up no claim to the said bond or any part thereof as witness of my hand and seal this 6th of November 1838
