Know all men by these presents that we Indian Chief of the County of Montgomery and State of Virginia and James Watson of the City of New York for divers good causes and considerations but more especially for and in consideration of the trust and confidence which we repose in Anderson Johnston of the County of Giles and State of Virginia have made ordained constituted and appointed and by these presents do make ordain constitute and appoint the said Anderson Johnston our true and lawful attorney young to him full power and authority to bargain for sell and by proper Deeds or Deeds coming to the purchaser or purchasers in fee simple for us and to us in like manner by Virginia or the Waters of Wolf Creek East River Branch Creek and New River and containing Eighty thousand acres and by these presents full power and authority in our name to prosecute any action or actions at law or in equity and in like manner to defend those which may be instituted or commenced against us or to the said lands necessary towards perfecting our title to the said lands

On any part thereof and on the attorney's own said
 one said attorney full power and authority in
 our name as aforesaid to sign seal and deliver
 any acquittance release or receipt which may be
 necessary for the discharge of all such persons
 in person or may be come indebted to us for
 the purchase of any part of the said lands upon
 the payment of the purchase money or any part
 thereof. And in like manner we do give to our
 said attorney full power and authority for us
 and in our name to ask demand and receive
 from any person or persons who may become indebted
