This Indenture made the 2nd day of August 1821 Between Rebecca Thompson of the County of Giles and State of Virginia the donor of the first part and Sam^l Thompson of the County and State aforesaid (the donee), of the 2nd part Witnesseth that the said Rebecca Thompson in order to secure the payment of sixteen dollars 75 cent with interest thereon from the 21st day of June 1821 till paid which sum the said Sam^l Thompson has this day bound himself as security for the said Rebecca Thompson to pay unto David & Andrew Johnston on or before the 21st day of June 1822 with interest thereon from the 21st day of June 1821 And for and in consideration of the further sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said Sam^l Thompson before the delivery of these presents the receipt thereof is hereby acknowledged both given granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth give grant bargain and sell unto the said Sam^l Thompson his heirs and assigns forever the following property to wit his part of the crop of corn now growing supposed to be about 41 Acres - One two year old horse bought last Spring his part of the crop of flax now growing and his part of the wheat and Rye now in stack supposed to be about fifteen bushels - One old pot and one old kettle - one old Table and one old Chest with the appurtenances unto the said Sam^l Thompson his heirs and assigns forever Upon Trust (nevertheless that the said Sam^l Thompson

Shall so soon as default be made in the payment of the aforesaid sum of sixteen dollars 75 cents with interest thereon from the 21st day of June 1821 till paid which the said Sam^l Thompson stands bound as the said Rebecca security to the said David & Andrew Johnston shall proceed to sell the aforesaid property at the house of the said Sam^l Thompson when he now lives to the highest bidder for ready money having first advertised the same at Giles Court house at least two weeks before the day of sale and on some Court day and from the proceeds of the said sale in the first pay, or retain to himself the said sum of sixteen dollars 75 cents with interest thereon from the 21st day of June 1821 till paid and all cost which may accrue for recording these presents and securing the said Trust - And the balance if any to pay to the said Rebecca Thompson or his legal representatives provided always and upon this express condition that if the said Rebecca Thompson her heirs or either of them shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said David & Andrew Johnston their heirs or assigns the aforesaid sum of sixteen dollars 75 cents with interest thereon as aforesaid on or before the 21st day of June 1822 or at any time thereafter so as to keep the said Sam^l Thompson from any injury on the payment of the said sum of sixteen dollars 75 cents with interest as aforesaid and all cost attending the recording these presents Then in that case these presents to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue - In Witness whereof the said parties have hereunto set their hands and Seals this day & Year above written
