Mary Lang of the County of Giles  
 State of Virginia being weak of Body but  
 of a sound and disposing mind and calling  
 to mind the uncertainty of life and certainty  
 of death do hereby make my last will and  
 testament in manner following First  
 I desire that all my real and personal estate  
 of whatever kind so ever to be sold by my executors  
 herein after named as soon as it can conveniently  
 done after my death, and all my debts collected  
 I desire that all my just debts and funeral  
 expenses be paid and the balance of whatever  
 may remain I desire may be equally divided  
 amongst my fourteen Grand Children viz eight  
 children which my daughter Hannah Mithila

Bottom has five children which my daughter  
 Mary has and one child which my son Alfred to say  
 have and I desire that James & Dunlap shall hold  
 the money which may belong to my Grand children  
 in the State of Virginia and the same out for their sup  
 port and Maintenance and lend out the same on  
 Interest as he may think fit for their use and I desire  
 that that portion which may belong to my son  
 Alfreds child be paid over to my son Alfred to be  
 managed by him for the use and benefit of his own  
 child

3<sup>rd</sup> I declare that my executors shall make deeds  
 for all my lands I have sold and conveyed as soon  
 as the purchased money be paid  
 Lastly I do hereby appoint my son Alfred C.  
 Lang & James A. Dunlap executors of this my last  
 will and testament hereby revoke my all former  
 wills by me made In testimony whereof I have  
 hereunto set my hand & seal this 20<sup>th</sup> day of October  
 1834

 of the County of Giles being weak in Body but  
 of sound mind and disposing memory for which  
 I thank God and calling to mind the uncertainty  
 of Human life and being desirous to repair  
 of all such worldly estate and hath pleased God  
 to bless me with life and bequeath the same in  
 the manner following that is to say I give unto  
 my three sons John Huffmon Jacob Huffmon and  
 Solomon Huffmon all my lands a greatly to be  
 fore said new doyle off to them to be by them  
 freely enjoyed forever I also give to my three sons  
 over Name of my personal property excepted
