I have made hereby my last will and testa-
ment in manner and forme following that is to
say

1st I give to my son William Haw one certain piece
or parcel of land which he is in possession of now
lying on the north side of my home plantation
to him and his heirs forever

2nd I give to my son Robert Haw all the mountain
part of my home plantation likewise to have my
home plantation at my wife death by paying
my son Thomas Haw four hundred dollars likewise

3rd I give to my son Robert Haw one half of my stock
of hogs & swine likewise one half of the property to
him and his heirs forever

3rd I give to my son James Haw the land he now
lives on by him being at the expence of obtaining
a title for said land to him and his heirs forever
4th I give to my son John Haw 60 dollars to him
and his heirs forever

5th I give to my daughter Anna Barn forty
three dollars to be paid out of personal property
to her and her heirs forever

6th I give to my wife Sally Haw 8 daughters
Nancy Haw & son Thomas Haw infant child
the remaining part of my home plantation
during my wifes natural life time likewise
after my first debts and funeral expences is paid
I give all my stock of horses cattle & one half of
my hogs likewise my house hotel and kitchen
furniture also one half of the benefit of my day
as orchard likewise one wagon and blacksmith
tools & all my farming tools to be divided equally
between my son Robert Haw and my son Thomas Haw
to them and their heirs forever

and lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint my
friends John Haw and Robert Haw executors of
this my last will and testament hereby revoking
all other or former wills or testaments

beulings made on writings whereof I have reviewed
to set my hand, and affixing seal this 15th day
of August in the year 1835. Signed sealed published
and declared by { John Hard son & co:
against for his last will and

and on his insistence have sub-
