In the name of God Amen I John Lewis of the County of Giles and State of Virginia do make and declare this my last will & testament in manner and form following:

That I resign my soul to God hoping and believing in atonement of my sins by the merits and precious blood of Jesus Christ and my body I commit to the earth to be buried at the discretion of my executors herein after named and my worldly estate I give and devise as follows

That I give and devise to George C. Trout the part of Land now vacant and in the occupancy of William Bunkerfield previous the said Trout pay certain other legacies heretofore mentioned of said Trout shall refuse to take the Land on such terms then the land to be sold at public sale and the proceeds to be applied as shall be hereafter mentioned And I give unto Henry Trout son of George C. Trout the sum of One hundred dollars Also I give to Elizabeth Trout daughter of George C. Trout the sum of One hundred dollars Also I give to George W. Trout son of George C. Trout the sum of One hundred dollars Also I give to Mary Anne Trout daughter of George C. Trout the sum of One hundred dollars

I also give to Mary C. Trout daughter of George C. Trout the sum of One hundred dollars Also I give to John W. Trout son of George C. Trout the sum of One hundred dollars Also I give to Anne Trout wife of George C. Trout the sum of One hundred dollars Also whereas James Requette is indebted to me One thousand and seven accounts the whole amount of which I give and bequeath to the said James Requette

Then I give and bequeath to my Lawful heirs the sum of One thousand Dollars and finally all the rest residue and remainder of my estate and effects real and personal whatsoever and wheresoever not herein after effectually disposed of after payment of debts legacies and funeral expenses and other charges and deductions as aforesaid I do give and devise and bequeath to George C. Trout

Also that my executors pay the aforesaid Legacies to the Legatee as they become of Lawful age to Mary and I do hereby appoint George C. Trout my sole executor of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty third day of May in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and forty three
