mit the whole of the rents & profits to escape a demand for herself to go to
the support of the children but from her natural goodness of heart I
have every confidence to hope that as she will be the only remaining person
of my orphan children when I am gone she will prove a mother to
them & will in all things do for them as in her judgment she thinks
will be most for their good:-
her more choice, more & female

will be made for their good -
 yet as I am firmly of opinion that every child male & female ^{such as}
 has an equal claim on the parent I desire & direct my executors or
 may then be called to act in that office on the coming of Youngest
 child of age when according to a previous provision of my will my
 estate shall be divided. Thus if by a previous division of the property
 my wife Elizabeth has made my children unequal heirs of her estate
 or if she be still living & her intentions can be certainly known that
 my executors, as above stated shall divide my estate among my
 children in that taking the two estates together they shall each
 have an equal portion -
